

ACADEMIC ADVANTAGES

Kellenberg Memorial High School offers a serious, four-year curriculum that thoroughly prepares students for college. The many academic advantages at Kellenberg are:

4 Years of Religion

(Scripture, Church History, Christian Morality, Christian Existence)

4 Years of English

(Grammar, Writing, Vocabulary, Public Speaking, and Literature)

4 Years of History

(World History, European History, two years of American History)

4 Years of Mathematics

(Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II & Trigonometry, Pre-Calculus or Intro to Calculus)

4 Years of Science

(Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics)

4 Years of World Language

(choice of French, Latin, or Spanish)

4 Years of Physical Education and Enrichment

(Art, Tae Kwon Do, Computer, SAT Preparation, Music, Health, Art Portfolio Preparation, Advanced Computer)

Kellenberg Memorial High School offers this time-tested curriculum to students with varying educational needs. Students in the Honors Program take four years of a world language. Students in the Academic I Program study a world language for three years and take a course in College Writing during the fourth year. Students in the Academic II Program take four years of English Composition in the place of a world language class. Academic II students also study American Sign Language in the Junior and Senior years. Also students may have the option to gain college credit in College Writing, American History II, Intro to Calculus, English 12 Honors, Art Portfolio Prep, Senior Religion, and World Languages.

Admissions and General Information

In addition to the high school program, Kellenberg Memorial also has a middle school division for sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. For more information on the Brother Joseph C. Fox Latin School, contact the Latin School Office.

In order to be considered for admission to the Freshman class, the student must successfully complete the eighth grade by passing all classes and presenting adequate academic credentials. The usual means of application begins with the Catholic High School Entrance Examination. Each applicant must sit for this exam on Saturday, October 26, 2013. An application for this test and other details on this program are available at all Catholic grade schools, Religious Education Centers, through the Kellenberg Memorial Admissions Office 516-292-0200, ext. 210 or at www.CHSEE.org.

Transfer students are not accepted for the Sophomore, Junior and Senior years of high school. The final judgment for admission is reserved to the sole discretion of the Principal.

KMHS does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, or national or ethnic origin in its educational, admissions, or financial policies, activities, athletics, or school administered programs.

KMHS, a Roman Catholic coeducational school, was founded to serve the Catholics of Long Island. Priority of admission is given to baptized Roman Catholic students.

Tuition for the 2013-2014 school year is \$8,575. This amount may be paid in full, over a ten month period, or in two larger installments. If tuition is paid in full at the beginning of the school year, the family receives a \$150 discount. The ten-month payment option requires parents to enroll in an automatic direct debit program. The two-payment option asks for one-half of the tuition on August 7th and the second half on January 7th. Each payment is made directly to the school. There is a \$250 non-refundable registration fee once a student has been accepted. There are no scholarships or other forms of student financial aid at the school.
