



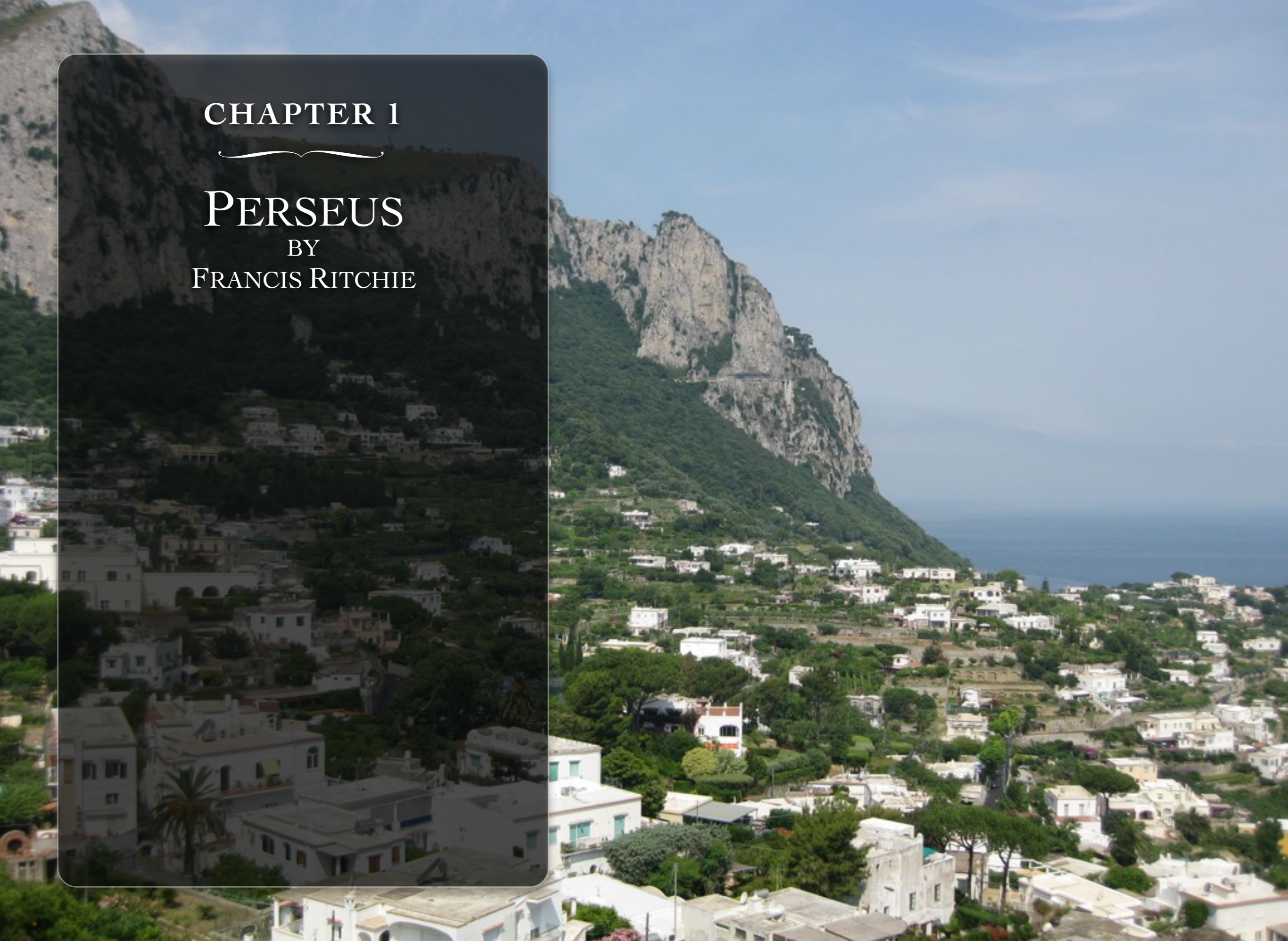

Haec narrantur a poetis de Perseo. Perseus filius erat Iovis, maximi deorum; avus eius Acrisius appellabatur. Acrisius volebat Perseum nepotem suum necare; nam propter oraculum puerum timebat. Comprehendit igitur Perseum adhuc infantem, et cum matre in arcā ligneā (5) inclusit. Tum arcam ipsam in mare coniecit. Danae, Persei mater, magnopere territa est; tempestas enim magna mare turbabat. Perseus autem in sinu matris dormiebat.

Perseus igitur multos **annos ibi habitabat**, et cum matre suā **vitam beatam** agebat. At Polydectes Danaen magnopere **amabat, atque** eam in **matrimonium ducere** volebat. Hoc tamen **consilium** Perseo **minime gratum** erat. Polydectes igitur Perseum **dimittere** constituit. Tum **iuvenem ad se** (5) **vocavit** et haec **dixit**: "**Turpe** est hanc **ignavam** vitam agere; **iam dudum** tu adulescens es. **Quo usque hīc manebis?** Tempus est **arma** capere et **virtutem praestare**. **Hinc abi**, et **caput Medusae mihi refer.**"

Perseus **ubi** haec **audivit**, ex insula **discessit**, et postquam ad **continentem** **vēnit**, Medusam **quaesivit**. **Diu frustra** quaerebat; **namque naturam loci ignorabat**. **Tandem Apollo et Minerva viam demonstraverunt**. **Primum ad Graeas, sorores Medusae, pervēnit**. Ab his **talaria** et (5) **galeam magicam** accepit. **Apollo autem et Minerva falcem et speculum** dederunt. **Tum postquam talaria pedibus induit**, in **aera ascendit**. **Diu per aera volabat**; tandem tamen ad eum locum **vēnit** ubi Medusa cum **ceteris Gorgonibus** habitabat. **Gorgones autem monstra** erant **specie horribili**; capita (10)

enim earum **anguibus omnino contecta erant**. **Manūs etiam ex aere factae erant**.

Polydectes magno timore adfectus est et fugere volebat. Dum tamen ille fugit,

Perseus caput Medusae monstravit; ille autem (10)
simul atque hoc vidit, in saxum versus est.

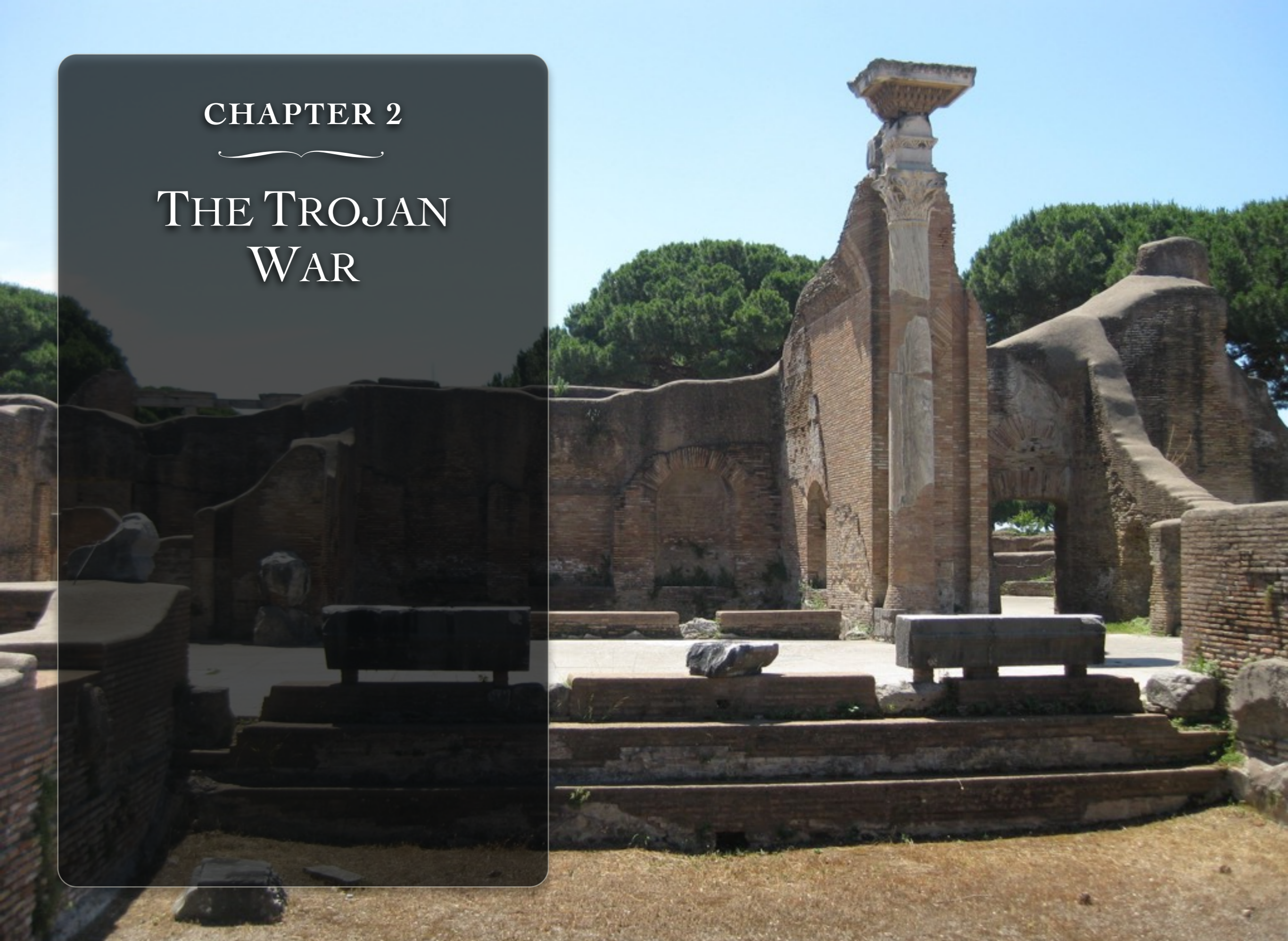

THE TROJAN
WAR



SECTION 1

The Judgement of Paris

Peleus, qui erat rex Thessaliae, **Thetidem**, deam maris, in matrimonio ducturus erat. Omnes dei et deae **nisi Discordia** ad nuptiam ab eo invitati erant. Tamen Discordia donum ferens eo vēnit. Donum erat **malum aureum** in quo **inscriptum** est “**pulcherrimae**.” Discordia malum inter (5) deas **Iunonem**, **Minervam**, et **Venerem** iecit. **Quaeque** dea putavit “**Malum aureum** est mihi.” **Tres** deae inter se rixabantur. Tandem ad Iovem iverunt et **rogaverunt** “**Quis** inter nos est pulcherrima?” Iuppiter **respondere recusavit**.

Ille “**Invenite** Paridem, filium **Priami** regis et (10) **pastorem** in campis **Troianis**” inquit.

Ubi deae Paridem invēnerant, eum rogaverunt “**Quis** est pulcherrima?”

Primum “**nescio**” respondit Paris. **Deinde** quaeque dea donum pastori **obtulit**. Iuno, **regina** deorum, (15) **potestatem insuper omnes gentes** obtulit.

Minerva “**Te bellatricem** faciam,” dixit, quod ea erat dea **sapientiae** atque **belli**.

Sed Venus dixit, “Ego **feminam** formosissimam tibi dabo.” Paris **diligenter** putabat, sed tandem malum (20) **Veneri** dedit.

“Est regina in Graeciā, nomine **Helena**, quae est femina formosissimam. Helena est uxor Menelai, regis **Spartae**. **Ī** Spartam et uxorem tuam duc!”

Troiam regressus, Paris **amicos** suos **convocavit** et (25) Spartam **navigavit**.

In Graeciā fratres **duo**, **Agamemnon** et **Menelaus** nomine, olim habitabant. **Graeci** fratres **Atridas** vocabant, quod **Atrei** filii erant. Agamemnon omnium **Argivorum** rex erat. Menelaus **Lacedaemonios** regebat. Helena, uxor Menelai, **praeclara** et formosa regina, cum **viro** in regiā (5) multos annos habitabat.

Paris cum multis **comitibus** ad regiam Menelai Spartaē vēnit. Manens in regiā, tandem Paris reginam conspexit. Simul ac Helenam vidit, eam amavit et rapere volebat. Post **multos** dies gratus reginae animo **fiebat** princeps (10) formosus. Quamquam perfidus et ignavus erat **princeps**,

pictis vestimentis et **nitidis capillis** fulgebat. Mox ab Helenā **quoque** amabatur.

Tandem nocte **obscurā** Helenam **furtim** rapuit et in navem eam **imposuit**. **Troiani vela candida ventis** (15) **secundis** dederunt, et **trans** mare Troiam **properaverunt**.

Mane, ubi Menelaus ad **cubiculum** uxoris vēnit, Helenam invenire non poterat. Ille fiebat **iratissimus**, et ad fratrem Agamemnonem statim contendit.

The Greeks Prepare for War

Agamemnon, **perfidia** Paridis narrata, ira terribili **exclamavit**, “**Perfidus** est Paris; perfidum est totum **genus** Troianorum, sed perfidiae **stultitiae**que poenas dabunt. Totum **exercitum** meum ad litora convocabo; **equites** **pedites**que in naves imponemus, et in terra marique (5) Troiam **oppugnabimus**. Ita urbem **sceleratam excidemus** et genus perfidum ad **Inferos** mittemus. **Praedam** quoque multam nos domum **reportabimus**. Tu quoque Helenam tecum domum ad regiam tuam **reduces**.”

Agamemnon igitur totum exercitum ad **portum** (10) convocavit. Multi equites et multi pedites **aderant**; principes quoque omnes e tota Graecia eo convenerunt. Sed duo

Graeci **aberant**: **Ulixes**, rex Ithacae, et **Achilles**, fortissimus omnium Graecorum.

Agamemnon nuntium ad Ithacam misit. Ulixes, qui (15) **filium infantem habebat**, ad bellum ire **nolebat**. **Insanus** igitur videri **temptabat**. Ubi nuntius ad Ithacam **advēnit**, Ulixem **arenas** in litore **arare conantem** conspexit. Hoc visō, nuntius putavit “Ille est insanus!” Mox tamen nuntius sensit “Ulixes **dolum** facit, **vero sanus** est ille!” (20)

Nuntius filium, **Telemachum**, cepit et ante **aratrum** **posuit**. Ulixes, infantem **laedere** nolens, aratrum **convertit**. Nunc **neesse erat** illi cum nuntio discedere. Deinde viri ad **alterum** regnum iverunt, **petentes** Achillem.

Thetis, mater Achillis, **mortem** filii timebat. (25) Achillem igitur **vestibus feminis** indutum ad regiam **amicae** misit. Ubi Ulixes et nuntius Agamemnonis ad regiam advenerunt, **solas** feminas videbant, **nullos** viros. Sed Ulixes **dolum** sensit. **Posterius** ad regiam regressus est vestem **mercatoris** gerens. Multas res feminae **ostendit**: (30) **gemmas** vestes pulcherrimas, et gladium magnum. Omnes

feminae gemmas et vestes cupiebant, set Achilles gladium cepit.

“Achilles!” **clamavit** Ulixes. “Agamemnon te **arcessivit**. Veni ad **oram** nobiscum.” Deinde Achilles et Ulixes ad oram iverunt et ceteros **milites iunxerunt**. (35)

SECTION 4

The Sacrifice of Iphigeneia

Omnibus militibus Graecis ad oram **congregantibus**, Agamemnon **nautas** naves parare iussit. Sed venti **adversi** naves in portu diu **retinebant**. **Itaque** Agamemnon nuntium ad oraculum **Delphicum** misit, et a Deo **responsum** petivit. **Triste** et terribile responsum dedit Apollo; “Propter iram (5) suam Diana naves Graecas in portu retinet, **nec** ventos secundos dat. **Numquam** Graeci ad **Asiam** navigabunt nisi Dea sanguine virginis **placata erit**.”

Rex, ubi responsum oraculi audivit, diu secum **lacrimabat**. “Est mihi domi,” inquit, “filia **cara**, (10) **Iphigeneia** nomine, puella **sedecim** annorum. Sine **dubio** Diana Iphigeneiam **victimam** petit. **Dira** et **crudelis** est Dea;

sed non sine dis **immortalibus** ad urbem Troiam navigabimus.” Nuntium igitur ad **Clytaemnestram**, uxorem suam, misit. (15)

“O Regina,” inquit, “filiam nostram ad nuptias **orna**, et cum **fidis custodibus** ad portum mitte quod Achilles, vir fortis et praeclarus, eam in matrimonium ducere vult.” Clytaemnestra, **dictis** regis auditis, magno gaudio filiam ad nuptias parat; gemmis **pretiosis** vestimentisque pictis (20) filiam ornat ut Achilli **bella** videatur, et tandem cum fidis custodibus ad portum mittit.

Sed ubi Iphigenia ad **castra** advenerat, milites **maestos** vidit. Capite **demisso**, Agamemnon filiam **salutavit** et de oraculo dixit. (25)

Tum puella vero animum ad mortem **firmavit** et fortem et **nobilemque** esse se **praebuit**. “Non mortem,” inquit, “sed **ignaviam** recuso. Libenter ad **Manes** descendam; morte meā Graecos milites et Graeciam **patriam conservabo**. Ita et Inferi et **Superi** me in **summo** honore habebunt **quia** (30) libenter pro patriā e vitā **excessero**.” Dixit Iphigeneia, et **vultu sereno** ad **aram processit**, et vitam cum sanguine

fudit. Graeci igitur, simul ac **numen** Dianae sanguine virginis
placatur, vela candida vento secundo dant, et Troiam
navigant ut urbem **Dardanorum obsideant.** (35)

The Trojans

Post mortem Iphigeneiae, Graeci Troiam navigaverunt. Ibi **moenia** alta Troiae **adoriri inceptabant**. Intra moenia erat multi Troiani qui **saepe** deos obsecrabant ut urbem civesque servarent. Priamus erat rex Troianorum. Priamus erat **senex**, sed cum uxore, **Hecubā**, **quinquaginta** filios (5) et multas filias habebat.

Omniū regis filiorum fortissimus, et patri carissimus erat **Hector**. Hic a civibus suis maxime amabatur et in summo honore habebatur. Cives Hectorem **adeo** amabant ut milites eum in **proelium** libenter **sequerentur**. (10) **Vehementer** a Graecis timebatur, ubi ex urbis **portis** ad proelium **ruebat**, aut ignibus **infestis hostium** naves

vastabat. Cotidie Troiani ad arma ab Hectore **incitabantur**; cotidie civium animi ad fortia **facta** firmabantur. Saepe cum Hectore a proelio **victores** regressi sunt. Multi fratres (15) cum eo **pugnabat**: **Polites**, **Helenus**, **Deiphobus**, **Troilus** et Paris. Omnes **praeter** Paridem erat **bellatores** fortissimi et **digni laude**.

Andromache, Hectoris uxor, cum viro et filioque in regiā habitabat. Nulla ex omnibus Troianis **mulier** (20) **magis** virum suum amabat, aut viri **amore** dignior erat. **Astyanax** erat filiulus infans Hectoris et Andromaches.

Hectori erat soror, nomine **Cassandra**. Cassandra erat **sacerdos** Apolloni. Ille deus ei donum **divinationis** dedit, sed nemo ei **credidit**. Cassandra fratri **imperavit** ne (25) Helenam Troiam ferret. “Illa **exitium** urbis nostrae secum **portabit!**” Ubi Cassandra Helenam in urbem **ambulantem** vidit, **velamen** aureum **corripuit** et eam **verberavit**.

Altera soror Hectoris erat **Creusa**. **Coniunx** Creusae erat **Aeneas**, filius **Anchisae** et deae Veneris. **Similis** (30) Hectori, Aeneas erat bellator fortissimus. Nepotes Aeneae **Romam condiderunt!**

SECTION 6

Hector Says Goodbye to Andromache

Adapted from Julia by Maud Reed

Olim Hector, ad proelium ornatus, e viā in regiam vēnit. Andromache vultu **laeto** virum salutavit et **ancillam** vocavit, quae filiolum in sinu tenebat. Deinde Hector **bracchia** ad puerum **porrexit**. Sed puer, cum **crisam rubram** vidit, quae ex patris galeā **horrebat**, **perterritus** est, nec ad patrem (5) venire **audebat**, sed multis lacrimis in ancillae sinu **haerebat**. Tum vero Hector, vir maximus, filio **risit**, et galeam terribilem **humi** deposuit ut filiulus non esset perterritus et bracchia iterum ad filium porrexit. Hic non iam perterritus est, sed risit, et patris collo bracchia parvula dedit. (10)

Sed Andromache **sollicito** animo virum his **verbis** **culpavit**: “O Hector,” inquit, “totam tuam vitam inter hostēs

et proelia agis; multi sunt hostes, qui te **odio** irāque petunt, multi quorum amicos ad Inferos misisti. E Troianis multi iam vulnerati, multī necati sunt. Nōn semper tu vulnera (15) infesta vitabis. Tu igitur hodie intra moenia mane, et te tuamque urbem conserva. Non enim sine te Troiani urbem **contra Graecos defendent.**”

Cui Hector respondit, “Hi omnes, qui nunc Troiam defendunt, ad me principem **spectant**. Propter meam (20) virtutem custodes in moenibus stant, milites ad proelia infesta animo forti excedere audent. Si ego proelia **detrectabo**, nec fortem me praebebo, non iam civium amore ero dignus. Troiani quoque omnes **timidi** erunt et mox ab hoste **vincentur**. Deinde Troia vastabitur, et vos ad (25) terram **alienam** in **servitute** ducemini. Non meum est proelia detrectare, sed **potius** pro patriā **cadere.**”

Dixit, et **oscula** filio uxoriq̄ue dedit. **Parvulum** ancillae tradidit, et armis ornatus in viam excessit. Andromachē ex **imo pectore gemitum** dedit, et capite demisso domum (30) **intravit**; nam **curis** sollicitis **vexabatur**, et **metuebat** ne Hector in proelio **moriturus** esset.

SECTION 7

The Wrath of Achilles

Omnium Graecorum, Achilles erat fortissimus. Multos annos ille cum militibus Agamemnonis pugnabat. In uno proelio, Graeci **templum** Apollonis ceperunt et duas sacerdotes, **Chryseidem** et **Briseidem** invenerunt. Agamemnon puellas sibi habere cupiebat, sed Achilles (5) **Briseidem** sibi **surrupuit**.

Ubi pater Chryseidis de fato filiae cognovit, deos immortales **oravit** ut **pestilentiam** Graecis mitterent. Pestilentia per castra Graecorum ita **transmigrabat** ut multi homines morerentur. Ille Graecis imperavit ut filiam (10) redderent. Agamemnon timebat ne **tot** Graeci necarentur ut Troianos **superare** non **posset**. Chryseide ad patrem redditā,

ille imperavit ut Briseis sibi **donaretur**. Achilles **servam** suam **duci** dare noluit, sed Agamemnon illam surripuit et ad **tabernaculum** suum portavit. Achilles erat tot iratus ut (15) pugnare recusaret. Sine illo, Graeci non **bene** pugnabant.

Mirabantur **quomodo** Troia sine Achille vinceretur. Multi Graeci metuebant ne Hector et milites Troiani castra Graeca adorturi essent. Agamemnonem orabant ut Briseidem Achilli daret, sed dux recusavit. Adhuc Achilles in (20) tabernaculo suo manebat, et milites suos, **Myrmidones**, pugnare **vetabat**.

SECTION 8

Paris Fights Menelaus

Multos annos Graeci et Troiani pugnabant quod Paris Helenam Troiam tulerat. Cotidie Paris Graecos in proelio amicos suos necantes spectabant. Cum Priamo et Hecubā Helena **super** moenia a quibus Menelaum et milites Graecos videre poterat sedebat. Omnes erant solliciti et **defessi** (5) propter bellum.

Tandem Paris Hectori dicit se finem belli facere velle. Non vult videre **plures** Troianos morientes. **Nuntiat** se solum cum Menelao pugnaturum esse. Hector nuntium ad Menelaum misit. Hōc audito, Menelaus et Agamemnon (10) cum Hectore **accordabant**. Milites Troiani Graecique nunc non pugnabunt, **modo** Paris et Menelaus. **Victori** erit Helena

et **divitiae**. Omnes Graeci domum **redire** poterunt, et Troia erit **salva**.

Ambo homines ad proelium paravit. Galeas (15) induerunt, **tela** gladiosque **sumpserunt** et ad **certamen progressi sunt**. Menelaus telum **primum** iecit. **Scutum** Paridis **percussit**, sed illum non laesit. Deinde Menelaus, carus **Marti**, deo belli, Paridem cum gladio oppugnavit, sed gladius **fregit!** Cur arma Menelai Paridi **nocere** non (20) poterant? Quod Venus, dea amoris, Paridem amavit. Illa Paridem ad Helenam regredi cupiebat. **Quidem** nunc Paridem **nube celatum** ad urbem reportabat ne Menelaus eum necaret.

Paride e proelio **egresso**, Menelaus est iratissimus. (25) Clamat Paridem esse ignavus. Imperat militibus Graecis ut Troianos statim adoriantur. **Indotia finita est**.

SECTION 9

The Death of Patroclus

Propter Briseidem Achilles adhuc pugnare recusabat. Cotidie Troiani plures milites Graecos **interficiebant**. Duces Graeci erant semper solliciti. Putabant se numquam terras suas redituros esse et **familias** suas iterum visuros esse. **Identidem** Achillem orabant ut arma sumeret et Troiam (5) excideret, sed Achilles semper recusavit. Tandem amicus Achillis, nomine **Patroclus**, ad tabernaculum ducis vēnit.

“Amice, oro et **obsecro** te ut mecum pugnes. Cotidie Hector, princeps Troianus, **socios** nostros adoritur et multos interficit. Hōc ipso tempore, ille naves Graecos cum (10) militibus suis oppugnat. Agamemnon, Ulixes, et multi **alii** vulnerati sunt. Si **nihil** facimus, Troiani naves nostras

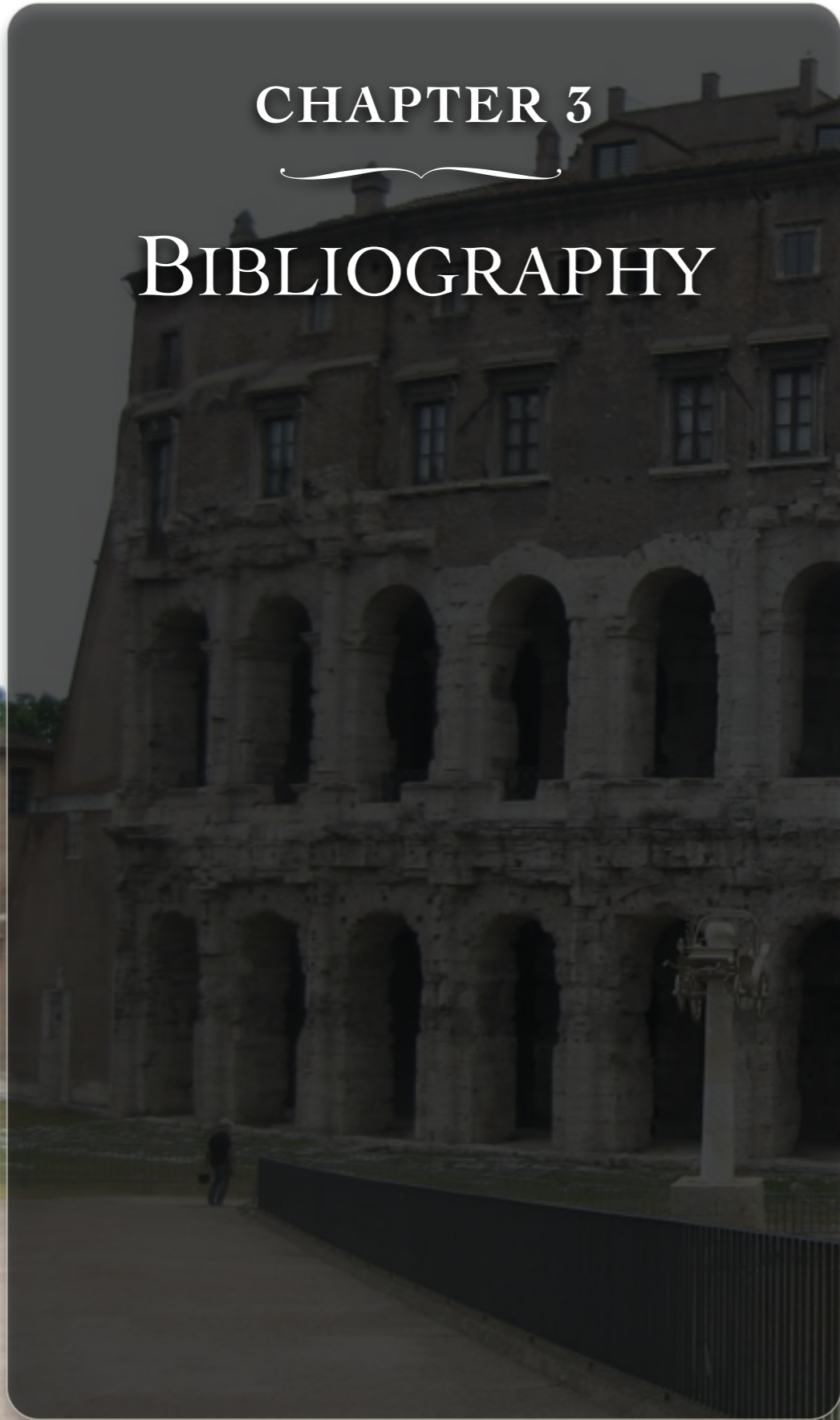
